Paying documentary stamp tax ("doc stamps") is not optional and must be paid unless you have a valid exemption. The department of revenue routinely reviews and audits documents to ensure that proper tax is paid.

Section 201.02(1)(a), Florida Statutes, imposes a tax (commonly referred to as documentary stamp tax) on documents that transfer, assign, or otherwise convey an interest in Florida real property at the rate of \$0.70 per \$100 on total consideration.

Consideration includes, but is not limited to, the money paid or agreed to be paid; the discharge of an obligation; and the amount of any mortgage, purchase money mortgage lien, or other encumbrance, whether or not the underlying indebtedness is assumed. If the consideration paid or given in exchange for real property or any interest therein includes property other than money, it is presumed that the consideration is equal to the fair market value of the real property that is transferred or interest therein.

Failure to pay the required tax may result in penalties equal to 10% of any unpaid tax if the failure is for 30 days, with an additional 10% for each additional 30 days, up to 50% of the unpaid tax. In addition, interest is charged based upon the amount of tax due from the date of recording until the tax is paid. §201.17(2)(c), Florida Statutes.
